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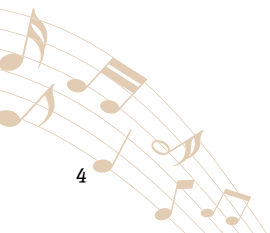

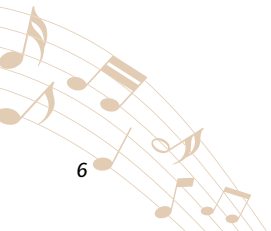

Dr Abigail Sin is a prize-winning Singaporean pianist who has performed in venues across Asia, Europe and North America as a concerto soloist, collaborative musician and solo recitalist. She is the co-founder of the *More Than Music* concert series in Singapore, which has won acclaim for its engaging, innovative presentation of classical chamber music. In 2020, *More Than Music* recorded the complete *Beethoven Violin Sonatas*, along with educational outreach content.

Abigail studied with Prof Thomas Hecht at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music, and with Joan Havill at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, where she was awarded the Romantic Piano Prize and the Ivan Sutton Chamber Music Award. She won top prizes at the Lagny-sur-Marne International Piano Competition (France), the Norah Sande Award (UK), the Royal Over-Seas League Competition (UK), and was a quarter-finalist in the Honens International Piano Competition (Canada). She is an alumnus of the Verbier Festival Academy and Yellow Barn Festival.


In 2019, Abigail completed a PhD at the Royal Academy of Music under the supervision of Prof Christopher Elton and Dr Briony Cox-Williams. Abigail is currently on the academic faculty of the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music in Singapore.



Born in Cebu, Philippines, **Prof. Albert Tiu** has been called “an artist of uncommon abilities” by American Record Guide. His latest Centaur recording, “Grand Russian”, pairing Tchaikovsky’s Grand Sonata and Rachmaninov’s 1st Sonata, was cited in ARG: “Even with some legendary competition in this repertoire, Tiu stands tall with his interpretations and technical accomplishment.” A previous disc, “The Classical Elements”, featuring twenty pieces grouped under Earth, Air, Water and Fire, was rated 5 Stars in International Piano and praised by Fanfare for a “fascinating recital containing some stunning playing.” His 2010 tribute to Chopin and Skryabin, “Nocturnal Fantasies”, featuring pairs of similarly-titled works by both composers, was dubbed “one of the all-time great piano recordings” by Fanfare.

Currently a Professor of Piano at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music, National University of Singapore, he studied with Jerome Lowenthal at the Juilliard School, with Michael Lewin at Boston Conservatory, and with Nita Abrogar-Quinto and Nelly Castro in the Philippines. A recipient of Juilliard’s William Petschek Award and a prizewinner of competitions in Calgary (Honens), Helsinki (Maj Lind) and Santander (Paloma O’Shea), he won the First Prize and two concerto prizes in the 1996 UNISA International Piano Competition in Pretoria, South Africa.

Known for his innovative programming, he has presented thought-provoking thematic recitals, like “Chopin: Before & Beyond” (works that influenced Chopin and works inspired by Chopin), and “Bee Flat” (the two



Sonatas in B-flat by Beethoven). He has performed with the St. Petersburg Philharmonic, Hamburg Symphony, Finnish Radio Symphony, Gstaad Festival Orchestra, Calgary Philharmonic, Winnipeg Symphony, and Philippine Philharmonic. In 2005, he gave the Singapore premiere of Samuel Barber's Piano Concerto with the Singapore Symphony under Tang Muhai. Other recent recording projects include collaborations with violist Zhang Manchin in the Brahms Viola Sonatas, and with tenor Alan Bennett in Schubert's "Winterreise", both on Centaur; with violinist Kam Ning in "Road Movies", a Meridian disc featuring American composers; and with cellist Qin Li-Wei, in two discs on Decca of Beethoven and Rachmaninov.

His "Students" have distinguished themselves in competitions and festivals around the world, and have pursued further studies in North America and Europe. Aside from teaching, he has adjudicated in international piano competitions in France, Denmark, New Zealand, Thailand and Indonesia.

He is addicted to Angry Birds, a constant source of humour in the family and in his studio, but somehow he still manages to practice some piano.

When it is in season, his addiction spreads to ice hockey, in which he supports the Pittsburgh Penguins.



Brenda Yeo is a distinguished music educator with over two decades of teaching experience, specialising in piano, keyboard, electone, and music theory.

Born and raised in Singapore, Brenda began her teaching journey in her early twenties, driven by her profound passion for music and her joy in mentoring children and teenagers. A dedicated lifelong learner, beyond the bachelor's degree Brenda continually enhances her skills through courses in music pedagogy, including Dalcroze and OrF Schulwerk methods, and holds a teaching diploma from the University of Cambridge.

In 2012, Brenda relocated to Sydney, Australia, when her husband accepted an assignment there. This move marked a pivotal moment in her career as she transitioned to full-time teaching. Immersed in a multicultural environment, Brenda developed innovative techniques such as "micro-dynamics" to refine her students' playing techniques and musical expressions.

Brenda established a thriving music school in Sydney's vibrant North Shore. Under her leadership, the school has grown to employ six dedicated teachers, offering instruction in piano, strings, woodwind and percussion instruments. Beyond technical mastery, Brenda's school provides opportunities for students to gain international exposure through performances and educational exchanges.



Clarence Lee was admitted to the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music at the age of 15 as a National Arts Council Scholar, and graduated with 1st class Honours where he was his class valedictorian and was awarded the coveted Lee Kuan Yew Gold Medallion as the top performing scholar of his cohort. Clarence also has a Master of Music degree from the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music, where he studied with Prof. Albert Tiu.

His honours and awards include achieving the distinction award at the 1st Hong Kong International Music Competition for Young Pianists (2014), 2nd Prize at the National Piano & Violin Competition, Artist Category (2011), 3rd Prize at the Conservatory's Piano Concerto Competition (2011), Platinum award at the Singapore Performer's Festival (2006) and Top Prize at the Young Pianist Competition Senior Category (2005).

Clarence has appeared as Concerto Soloist with the Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Artsakh State Chamber Orchestra, Singapore Chinese Orchestra, Metropolitan Festival Orchestra, Braddell Height's Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra of the Music Makers, Singapore Festival Orchestra and the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory's New Music Ensemble.


Clarence is currently on the Piano Faculty at LASALLE College of the Arts, University of the Arts Singapore.



Born and raised in Melbourne, **Daniel Le** was hailed by the New York Concert Review as a “brilliant young pianist.” Daniel has enjoyed an international career spanning four continents. He has been described as an incredibly versatile soloist, chamber musician and innovative artist.

After Daniel's debut with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra in 2015, he was immediately re-engaged for two consecutive seasons. In 2019, he made his debut with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl. Other performances have brought Daniel to venues including Lincoln Center in New York, Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Centre, Melbourne Recital Center, Hamer Hall, Queensland Performing Arts Theatre and Concert Hall, and Waseda University in Japan. Competition successes include top prizes in the Lev Vlassenko Piano Competition, Australian National Piano Award, and Kerikeri International Piano Competition. He was recently a finalist in the Naumburg International Piano Award in New York City.

Daniel is also an active chamber musician and recently won the Fuchs Chamber Music Competition . He has collaborated with members of the Chamber Music Society at the Lincoln Center. Festival appearances include Norfolk Chamber Music Festival and Bowdoin International Music Festival where he worked with renowned musicians from the Emerson, Brentano, Shanghai and Miro String Quartets. Recent collaborations include ensembles such as the Southern Cross Soloists, Camerata Chamber Orchestra and Queensland Symphony Orchestra as soloist in Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue.




Daniel completed his studies at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music as a two-time recipient of the Steven Baxter Scholarship under Prof. Thomas Hecht, and his Master and Doctorate degrees at the Manhattan School of Music with Andre-Michel Schub. A keen and passionate pedagogue, Daniel continues to give masterclasses and workshops across Asia and Australia.



Karen Wong, co-founder of Forte Musicademy, embodies the philosophy that comprehensive, structured, and robust musical foundations are vital for every aspiring musician.

Karen's academic journey includes graduating with honors from the University of Wales, where she earned prestigious awards such as the Yo Kiang Beng Music Scholarship and the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) Degree Studies Scholarship, alongside being recognized as the Best Graduate. For eight years, she was a lecturer at NAFA, imparting her expertise in Harmony and Practical Musicianship. Concurrently, she played a pivotal role at the School of Young Talent within NAFA, shaping young minds in piano, theory, and aural skills, and contributing significantly to establishing the music program at NAFA Arts Kindergarten.

Transitioning from her tenure at NAFA, Karen founded Forte Musicademy in 2010, where she holds the roles of Director and Head of Keyboard, Curriculum, and Academics. Under her guidance, numerous musicians have flourished, achieving remarkable success in prestigious competitions worldwide. Karen's students have secured top honors in international piano competitions, alongside triumphs in numerous placing in the Singapore's National Piano and Violin Competition, Steinway Youth Piano Competition, and Piano Island Competition. Additionally, her students have excelled as ABRSM High Scorers and recipients of the Hedy King Robinson Prize.




With over two decades of experience in piano pedagogy, Karen possesses strong analytical skills, enabling her to effectively educate students of all levels, including those with learning differences such as dyslexia, dyspraxia, ADD, ADHD, and autism. Her commitment to instilling a love for music and empowering her students with purpose sets the foundation for their lifelong musical journey.



Dr Lee Pei Ming was an Assistant Professor in Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music at National University of Singapore. She taught at the university for 13 years from 2005-2018. Lee graduated with a Doctorate in Musical Arts (DMA) in Piano Performance and Pedagogy at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor in 2005 and achieved her Licentiate and Fellowship (F.T.C.L.) from Trinity College in London with honors prior to her degrees.

Lee's research paper on "Infant Musicality in the New Generation" was published in INTED conference in Spain, and she presented papers at the prestigious World Piano Pedagogy Conference at Texas, USA and in Malaysia. Lee is also the founder of the music program Staccato! Music, which specializes in early childhood music and movement program since 2009. The program is based on her research on developing accurate pitching abilities in young children. Due to the success of the program, Staccato! Music was awarded Promising SME 500 in 2013. The early childhood program has been adopted by several well-known kindergartens in Singapore, like Carpe diem, Little Skool House, Bibinogs, My World by YMCA over the years. In 2018, Staccato! Pte Ltd ventured into the China market with Prodigy Music in Shanghai, and expanded a new branch near Orchard Road at Balmoral Plaza in 2024.



Lee has conducted several pedagogy workshops and lecture recitals held in Singapore for the People's Association, The Arts House, Singapore Symphony Orchestra (SSO) and Ministry of Education (MOE) schools over the years. Lee also founded the Pedagogy Series in 2015 to help raise funds for the financially- challenged students and the less-privileged in collaboration with RICE Holdings.


In recent years, Lee has several students who had achieved distinction in their ABRSM or Trinity piano examinations. Ong Weng Yee headed to Chetham's School of Music in Manchester, to pursue a music education, after achieving her grade 8 with distinction when she was 8 years old. Goh Kai Cheng was awarded the grand- final winner in the 5th Annual Steinway Piano Competition, to represent Singapore in the Regional Round in 2020. Yao Hua Cheng won the Best Etude Award in the UCSI University International Piano Festival and Competition 2024.

In addition to her passion for teaching, Lee has performed in the 13th ASEAN Summit 2007 Gala Dinner, and in the Singapore International Piano Festival in 2006 at the Victoria Concert Hall. In 2006, Lee premiered Eine Kleine Mitternachtsmusik by American composer George Crumb in Michigan and Singapore. Other places that Lee has performed include Czech Republic, Italy and USA.



Dr. Tarin Supprakorn is active as a recitalist, collaborative pianist, and piano pedagogue. 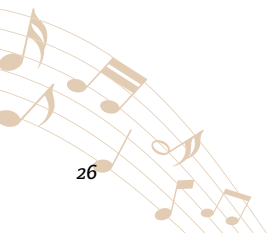
